DOMINO'S OFFICIALLY OPENS ITS NEW COMMISSARY

New facility at West Ashland offers state of the art dough production

Domino's Pizza, the UK's leading pizza delivery company, is today [July 1, 2010] delighted to officially open its new state of the art commissary at West Ashland in Milton Keynes. The ceremonial ribbon was cut by Domino's CEO Chris Moore and Pete Winkelman, chairman of MK Dons, the pizza company's new next door neighbour.

The £28million facility will provide the dough for over half of Domino's 600-plus stores and has the capacity to support Domino's planned expansion to 1,200 stores by 2021.

The new commissary has been built to the BREEAM (Buildings Research Establishment Environmental Assessment Method) Excellent rating – the highest attainable standard. Environmental measures in the new facility include collecting rain water to use for toilets.

Domino's Pizza has been based in Milton Keynes since it opened its first dough production site in the city in Tongwell in 1986. In 1998 the Company moved to its current site in Kingston and the move to West Ashland will be completed when a new head office is built on the West Ashland site in the near future.

Chris Moore, Domino's chief executive, said: "We are delighted with our new commissary. We have taken the best expertise in the world to build a fantastic dough production facility that will underpin our expansion plans for the future. We are celebrating 25 years of Domino's in the UK this year – and what better way to commemorate it than with the opening of such a great facility."
